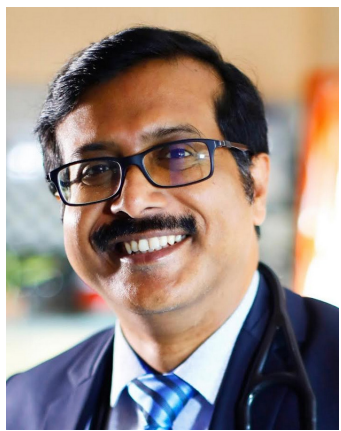

# Retired officer defrauded of lakhs

Gathiyas, on the pretext of process charges, made a claim that the policy amount of Rs.12.50 lakhs to the retired officer of Gandhinagar GEB Power Station, if the maturity amount of the policy is more than ten lakh rupees, the insurance amount will be paid from the Lokpal Aayog. A complaint has been registered at Gandhinagar Range Cyber Crime Police Station after fraud was committed by transferring 76.29 lakhs. Rajnikant Valjibhai Patel, residing in New Vavol Siddharth Residency, Gandhinagar has retired from the post of DYSA at GEB Power Station in the year 2019. Last December 2023, a person named Anant Rai called on mobile and said that your Max Life Insurance Rs. 12.50 lakh will be paid from the Insurance Ombudsman Commission if the policy maturity is more than ten lakh rupees. For which we will send your policy file to Insurance Ombudsman. Later, a person named Ashutosh Agarwal called and assured that since the insurance policy file has reached the insurance ombudsman, some charges will have to be paid to process the policy and all the amount paid as charges will be returned to you in Tamash Bank account. Under which on 24 January 2024 Rs. 1.99 lakh was deposited in the bank account provided by Rajinikanthbhai.

After that on the pretext of different charges Ashutosh Aggarwal extorted from him a total of Rs. 30.69 lakhs were transferred to different accounts.

## card holders will no longer suffer

**Gandhinagar**, The state government has taken a big decision for the 73 lakh NFSA (National Food Security Act) cardholders of Gujarat. Now while going to buy ration, you will not find the cheap grain shop closed. The government has taken this decision after receiving complaints about the closure of cheap grain shops. According to the new decision, like government officials, now ration distributors will have to hand over the charge in their absence. Thus, the ration card holders will not have to push the shop. In the absence of the distributor, the ration distributor has to inform the district supply officer about who has been assigned the charge. The system has to be informed as to which other person will run the shop in the absence of the distributor. It may be mentioned that 700 shops have been registered for distribution of cheap food grains in the state.

Shops will be closed and open during this time. The timings of rationing shops are 8.30 am to 12 pm and 3.30 pm to 6 pm. While shops are closed on Mondays and public holidays.
